- GET STARTED work clockwise around a room or do a specific area just do it!
- THROW AWAY it's OK to throw away unneeded, old, dirty or broken items
- GIVE AWAY donation centers, as well as family and friends may appreciate your gifts
- SHRED personal/household/financial information can be shredded for a nominal fee
- **PUT AWAY** when neatly organized, there is a place for everything
- **THREE RULES** 
  - Visibility: transparent containers easily identify contents for future access
  - Accessibility: items used most should be easy to get
  - Flexibility: adapt to your changing needs

SAFETY - no cluttered hallways, no cords to walk over, no hidden 'stuff' to fall into FINISH – step back and feel good about what you have accomplished!






## **Valuation Guide for Goodwill Donors**



The U.S. Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires donors to value their items. To help guide you, Goodwill Industries International has compiled a list providing price ranges for items commonly sold in Goodwill<sup>®</sup> stores. Assume the following items are in good condition, and remember: prices are only estimated values.
