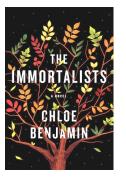

Staying Safe With Pets in the Home

- Put a bell on a dog or cat's neck so you can hear them coming.
- Squat to clean up after your pet, rather than bending over, which is bad for joints and compromises breathing.
- If you will be up and active, consider putting the animal in a kennel or separate room to avoid tripping on them.
- Put excitable animals in a separate room when company arrives, particularly animals that can knock people down.
